Antonia has lived in Bristol for nearly 30 years, having come here to train to be a teacher after completing her Geography degree. She has worked in education ever since starting her career as a classroom teacher of geography in a Bristol secondary school. She then moved into a curriculum support role for Bristol Local Education Authority, supporting schools and teachers to implement the introduction of Citizenship Education into the national curriculum.

Antonia then joined the School of Education at the University of Bristol to train teachers. She ran the Citizenship PGCE programme for several years before becoming the university lead for the Teach First Initial Teacher Education Programme. Her work with Teach First, which seeks to remove socio-economic barriers to positive educational outcomes for all children by working with challenging schools, inspired her to become involved in governance structures in Bristol schools. Antonia sits on the local governing body at BCCS and is also one of the members for the trust.

Antonia is now an Associate Professor at the School of Education, lecturing on the Education Studies undergraduate programme. She has been fortunate to enjoy a varied career in education and wonders what might be next. She is married to Ken and has two sons, one of whom is at Cathedral Primary School. She is a lover of all music, sings in the Exultate singers as a soprano and tries to go to the Glastonbury festival every year.
