Headteacher update:

Linked to the Mind mental health awareness campaign yesterday, we have been talking to the children about mental health and the importance of understanding how to look after our mind (and emotions) as well as our body. It may not always be obvious to children (or adults) how much time we spend in school focusing on well-being, but it permeates our curriculum on a day-to-day basis.

Alongside our PSHE curriculum, for which there are explicit weekly lessons, children have sessions throughout the day when we talk to them or show them ways to help themselves feel calm and settled. We also have explicit spaces in each classroom and around the school where there are resources to use to help children to 'calm'. Alongside this we have an embedded culture where we follow calm, consistent routines throughout things we do, all leading to a sense of calm and safety.

We realise that at times, for reasons in school and out, children have 'wobbles' where they need more support. Staff are well trained in strategies to coregulate with children and we also have some targeted interventions to support children who we identify as in need of some extra support.

Our website has an area under <u>'supporting your child at home'</u> with some suggestions, as well as links to NHS and other trusted sources where you can find out more about how to help your child to maintain their emotional health. We also schedule coffee mornings throughout the year where we
