### Headteacher update:

"The limits of my language means the limits of my world."? Ludwig Wittgenstein

Oracy, and the value of talk to support children to make sense of new ideas, has always been central to our curriculum. In the past few years we have followed the research evidence in developing the planned vocabulary that we want children to know and understand in each subject area. During our INSET today, staff at our school and the junior school have been reflect on further developing vocabulary teaching strategies to 'unlock' some of the ore challenging subject-specific words are children need to understand in ways that capitalise on their curiosity and word play. Children enjoy spotting patterns through looking at root words, antonyms (opposites) or words that sound similar and can increase their understanding through examples of the word in different contexts.

Teacher also had a lively session learning about a new PE curriculum we are adopting. Following a successful trial and on the recommendation of HJS, we are moving to follow 'Get Set 4 PE' which we believe offers more active teaching sessions than our current curriculum as well as improved application to sport. we hope that you'll hear some positive feedback from your child following this change.
